

# Cartography of Reggio Emilia

Researchers looking for documents of this kind immediately head to the collections that are guaranteed to contain them, such as those of cadastral surveys, land registers and maps by qualified land surveyors.

Therefore, a useful guide has been provided for the vast majority of the plans and maps. It divides them by the archives in which they are found and states what they portray.
